Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed students across the nation from Vigyan Bhawan in New Delhi on Monday i.e. on 11th September 2017 to mark the centenary celebration of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya and 125 years of Swami Vivekananda's address at the Chicago World Parliament of Religions. The PM addressed the nation to remind one and all about the relevance and significance of Swami Vivekananda's teachings in the backdrop of today's social milieu. Addressing the event, PM Narendra Modi stressed on his Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan. He said that Indians do not have the right to chant Vande Mataram if they go on to spit pan and throw garbage on roads. He further added that those who clean the roads and surroundings have the first right in the country.



Speaking about Swami Vivekanada's address in at Parliament on Religion in Chicago on 11 September, 1983, PM Modi said people in India remember 9/11 of 1893. "Today is 9/11...this day became widely spoken about after 2001 but there was another 9/11 of 1893 which we remember. Just with a few words, a youngster from India won over the world and showed the world the power of oneness," the Prime Minister said. A film on Upadhyaya and Vivekanda was also shown at the event.

While Modi addressed the young audience, several cabinet ministers interacted with the participants on issues like poverty, cleanliness, terrorism, communalism, casteism and corruption. Young leaders had been called upon by the PM so that both the government and youth will find a way to contribute to the society.
